Kota Kinabalu (KK), the state capital of Sabah, Malaysia, is located in the northwest coast of Borneo.

The ASM will open on <u>Tuesday 29 July</u> with a spotlight on Sabah, with local stakeholders and policymakers invited to attend the welcome address. Day 1 sessions will focus on stakeholder engagement and Universal Health Coverage (UHC) in regards to both global and local contexts.

The sessions on <u>Wednesday 30 July</u> will focus on research updates, with a mix of on-stage presentations and poster presentations.

On <u>Thursday</u> morning, all delegates will participate in site visits to two health clinics in Sabah – a key feature of RESPIRE ASMs, and an opportunity to learn about the challenges and opportunities faced by Sabah's rural healthcare system. Thursday afternoon is dedicated to platform updates, with each platform showcasing their activity through interactive stalls.

Finally, on <u>Friday</u> morning, delegates will co-develop plans for forward planning. In breakout groups, delegates will "ignite" their ideas into actionable proposals that build on the success of RESPIRE activity.
